FRIENDS OF CARNFORTH COKE OVENS

This group maintains the Coke Ovens and surrounding site, together with ovens in Lancaster and Bolton-le-Sands. The Ovens are one of several sets of coke ovens along the northern stretch of the Lancaster Canal.



The Carnforth ovens are in a pleasant small green space, accessible from a footpath leading beside the canal from Bridge 127. The back wall is visible from the towing path. The Friends aim to protect and stabilise the ovens. At present we are trying to reduce any damaging vegetation and to reveal the canal wharf associated with the ovens. We meet at work parties.

THWAITE BROW WOODS CONSERVATION GROUP

This group undertakes the management of a fourteen acre woodland on behalf of the Parish Council. The work includes minor tree work, maintenance of the path network and fences, managing the woodland to encourage wildlife diversity, including erection and maintenance of bird nesting boxes and bat boxes. The group undertakes and oversees implementation of work in accordance with a Forestry Commission approved Woodland Management Plan.



Work parties are held once a month:

September - April: 10am/1.45pm on 2nd Sunday of the Month.

May: 7pm on 3rd Tuesday of the Month

June, July, August: 7pm on 3rd Thursday of the Month.

PUT YOUR GREEN SPACES ON THE MAP

Lancaster City Council needs your help to identify special areas of Local Green Space across the district.

Access to a network of high- quality open spaces and opportunities for sport and physical activity is important for health and the wellbeing of communities. Local communities are being asked to identify the Local Green Spaces that are of special local importance. They could be special for many reasons, for example they may have an association with an historical event or represent a valuable feature in the landscape. Areas of land identified as being Local Green Spaces are protected from development in much the same way as Green Belt. Local Green Spaces can only be designated when a Local Plan is being prepared or updated. The call for Local Green Spaces is open until Monday 28 July 2025. COMMUNITY WINGS PROJECT

Butterfly Conservation is running a national project called Wild Spaces focussing on all the spaces around us that can become better wild spaces for butterflies and moths. You can register your wild space, wild-spaces.org.uk, be it a windowbox, or a garden, and



find out lots of information about what species you might see or how you can improve it for these seriously declining insects.

Lancaster District have adopted this project and want everyone's help to register their spaces, get involved in The Big Butterfly Count and National Moth Week, and do something to improve that area. It will also be a catalyst for bringing communities together through joint events, training in habitat assessment for butterflies and moths, moth surveying, and sharing their experiences.
